

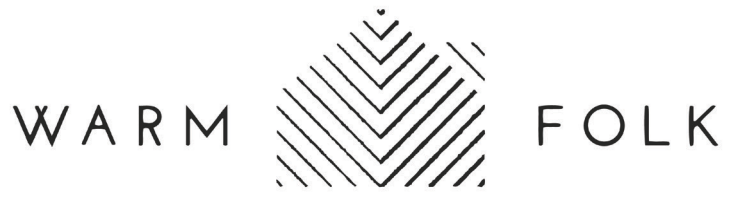

Hand Quilting Basics Workshop



Hand quilting is an elegant, and personal, way of finishing a quilting project. We'll cover the basting process, design selection, tying knots, thread conditioners, how to start/finish each line of stitches, and how to work efficiently to maintain excitement and progress. We'll focus on durability so that you have confidence your work will survive for years to come.

MATERIAL LIST

- Bring your own small quilt sandwich or purchase a practice sample during the workshop.
- If you bring your own, your sandwich should have:
 - A quilt back that is 4 inches larger on all sides than the top
 - Batting* that is 2 inches larger on all sides than the top
- Safety pins for basting (to assist as we thread baste), one pin for every 5 square inches of your quilt top.
- Favorite thimble (my favorite is included in the kit, but you may prefer to use your own)
- 12 wt thread (a small pool of a neutral color will be included in the kit, but you may prefer to bring your own colors).

*I have hand quilted with cotton, bamboo, and wool batting. I have not discovered tremendous differences in the ease of quilting, but the effects will be slightly different depending on the material selected (wool has more loft and will likely be poofier. I recommend cotton or bamboo for our purposes, but polyester is also acceptable.
